IMPLEMENTATION

At Pewithall Primary School, Musician of the Month has become a joyful part of our school culture. It's sparked curiosity, creativity, and some brilliant conversations across all year groups. We use MOTM in assemblies, classroom lessons, and corridor displays.

IMPACT

It's helped broaden musical horizons, build confidence, and create shared experiences that go far beyond music.

Children now talk about artists with real insight, and staff feel more empowered to bring music into their teaching.

One standout moment was our Kylie Day in July, where we celebrated Pride and honoured a year's worth of pupil favourites from Musician of the Month. Every class learned a Kylie song and dance — from Reception to Year 6 — and the whole school came together in a rainbow of energy and celebration. It was colourful, inclusive, and full of joy. The children were buzzing with excitement, and staff joined in too (with varying degrees of dance coordination!).

Thanks again for all you do — it's made a real difference here.

M.A.T. CASE STUDY

IMPLEMENTATION

We launch the MOTM in our singing assembly at the start of the month and I produce a poster that gets displayed in every classroom. A main display is then put up in the hall of each school. We send out a guessing poster to parents on social media the week before we tell the children and then share the name of the artist on the day we launch it! The artist is then shared through our weekly parent newsletter.

We have 2 chosen pieces that the children listen to a lot in class. These are used in every assembly and we select 3 key facts that the children have to learn.

IMPACT

The children love MOTM, some more than others, but we stress the fact that we are open to new music and we talk about the influences the artists have on each other.

It really helps to prioritise music across the school and keep it fresh in peoples minds.

The children can be heard singing the songs around school which is lovely.
